

Year 11 GCSE and BTEC Results: Celebrating Our Through-School Community



We are once again overwhelmed with pride as we celebrate the outstanding achievements of our Year 11 GCSE and BTEC students. Every student has worked exceptionally hard, and today we are delighted to share this special moment with them and their Safa families.

Safa Community School is proud to mark another record-breaking year of academic achievement across both GCSE and BTEC qualifications. Our largest-ever cohort completed 1,181 GCSE entries, achieving results that rank among the strongest in the school's history, including:

- **A 14% increase in Grade 9s**
- **An 11% increase in Grades 8–9**
- **A 9% increase in Grades 7–9**

Our BTEC students have also continued to perform exceptionally well, further strengthening Safa's reputation for excellence across both academic and vocational pathways.

These exceptional outcomes reflect the determination and resilience of our students, together with the tireless dedication of our teachers, staff and families, who have supported them throughout their journey.

These achievements are particularly significant given the unprecedented circumstances surrounding this year's examination series. Against a backdrop of regional conflict and disruption, nearly 7,000 pieces of supporting evidence were carefully prepared and submitted to ensure that every student's achievement was appropriately represented. This considerable undertaking reflects the extraordinary commitment, professionalism and attention to detail demonstrated by our staff throughout this challenging period.

"This year's GCSE and BTEC results tell a much wider story than qualifications and grades alone. They reflect the journey of our school, the strength of our community and the remarkable progress we have made together.

At least half of this Year 11 cohort completed their early years or primary education with us. Some started as FSI pupils when the school first opened in 2014. To see these "homegrown" students now completing their GCSE and BTEC qualifications with such strong results is a particularly proud milestone.

Their journey has not always been easy. They completed their primary education during the global pandemic and faced further disruption when conflict affected their studies during Term 3. "This is an exceptionally talented year group, with students achieving at a high level across a wide range of academic, sporting, creative, and entrepreneurial disciplines. Alongside their academic studies, students have competed internationally in sports, performed in music and the arts, developed business interests, and taken on leadership roles within the school and the wider community.

Today is an important day for our 131 GCSE students and their families. I have had the privilege of watching this year's group develop, and what stands out to me is the breadth of their talents and achievements. They are much more than their examination results.

The cohort includes a particularly strong group of elite swimmers representing Cyprus, Egypt, the United Kingdom, Italy, Spain, Switzerland, France, India, and the UAE. Students have competed at the European Junior Championships in Germany and the Mediterranean Games, while others have been working towards Olympic qualifying times.

Balancing international-level sport with the demands of GCSE study requires significant commitment, organisation and resilience. Students have travelled extensively, trained for many hours and competed at the highest levels while continuing to meet the demands of their academic programmes. The students' achievements have also created significant opportunities beyond SCS, with some of the school's swimmers securing full scholarships to Millfield and NCAA Division I universities in the United States.

However, the success of the cohort extends well beyond elite sport.

Academic results matter. They provide important opportunities and help students progress towards the universities, careers, and pathways they aspire to. However, we also want our students to develop interests, skills, and experiences beyond the classroom.

This year group includes musicians, entrepreneurs, performers, athletes, and emerging leaders. For me, that is an important part of what we are trying to achieve at SCS. We want students to leave us with strong academic qualifications, a clear understanding of their strengths, and the confidence to pursue their ambitions.

Behind the students' achievements has been a significant programme of work from teachers and school leaders. More than 7,000 pieces of evidence relating to student achievement, progress and wider experiences have been analysed, submitted and uploaded.

The scale of that work demonstrates the level of attention our staff give to our students. Our teachers know their students well. They know who is training before school, who is competing internationally, who is performing, who is developing a business, and who may need additional support.

That understanding is important because it enables us to support students as individuals rather than simply focusing on examination data. It also means that the wider achievements of our students are properly recognised.

The strength of the SCS community is reflected in the school's high retention rate, with around 70% of students having a sibling who attends the school. Many of today's Year 11 students will continue their education at SCS, joining the Sixth Form and progressing onto A Level, BTEC, and internship pathways.

The fact that so many families choose to continue their SCS journey with us is something we value highly. For many of these students, today is not the end of their time at SCS but the beginning of their Sixth Form experience."

"The school has spent the summer preparing its Sixth Form facilities for continued growth. A new bespoke KS5 floor is being opened, providing additional science and mathematics classrooms to support the popularity of STEM subjects and the expansion of the Sixth Form.

The development also includes a redesigned Sixth Form common room and study areas, additional strength and conditioning facilities, and improved catering provision for older students.

The latest addition is likely to be particularly popular with students: personalised Sixth Form student car parking spaces.

We have invested significantly in our Sixth Form environment to provide students with the facilities, space and independence they need as they move towards university, employment and adult life. The new academic and sporting facilities are particularly important as our Sixth Form continues to grow.

The personalised parking spaces may prove to be the most popular addition of all, but I suspect the new science classrooms will ultimately have the greater long-term impact."
