


# Key Student Facts

### Curriculum

At SCS we follow the National Curriculum of England.

The primary school is broken into two key stages: Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and 2) and Key Stage 2 (Year 3 - 6).

Class teachers are responsible for the teaching and learning of the timetabled lessons including; English, Maths, Science, Humanities and Moral, Social and Cultural Studies (MSCS). With our curriculum offering, students are then taught by specialists, specifically trained teachers, for PE, Swimming, Music, Art, Performing Arts, Computing, Science Technology Engineering and Maths (STEM), Arabic, Islamic (if applicable), and Modern Foreign Languages

(French, German, Spanish or Mandarin).

**O**ur creative, child led curriculum is designed around overarching concepts, which provide students with real life context that integrates and connects all curriculum areas. As a school, we ensure that we offer a consistent and seamless progression as the children transition across the different phases throughout the primary school. 

### Wellbeing Curriculum

A t Safa we pride ourselves on the care and support we offer our students, parents and teachers. Pastoral care is a major strength of the school, and we pay particular attention to getting to know all of the students as individuals. Everyone can need support in different ways at different times throughout their life so we have systems and procedures in place to monitor student wellbeing. Safa Community School staff work closely with one another to ensure our students' wellbeing and individual physical and emotional needs are supported in close liaison with our parents, counsellor and external agencies.

### The transition into school life but also between the different phases of our school is carefully and seamlessly planned for.

 ur caring ethos is based on mutual respect for one another and on appreciating individuality. Happy students make for positive learners. Our goal is to ensure that all students enjoy coming to school, embrace the challenges ahead of them and are fully prepared for what lies ahead of them in the future.

#### Year Group to Year Group

Throughout term 3, a major focus for us is transition. There are planned weeks where specific lessons are based around gathering information from the students on how they are feeling, answering questions, taster lessons, as

well as visiting their new year group. Parent Webinars are sent out to provide information on any changes from one year group to the next as well as optional workshops and sessions during specific transitions such as Primary to Secondary.

#### New Students

In order for us to support new students joining SCS, playdates and tours are offered before the start date. In addition a pastoral survey is sent to new families to allow us to use this information to make the best informed class placement choice for the child. Parent webinars will be shared to provide specific information as well as 'meet the teacher' profiles and videos

### Wellbeing Curriculum

#### Wellbeing at Safa

Staff and student wellbeing is at the heart of everything that we do at Safa Community School. Our bespoke Wellbeing curriculum promotes our 11 key values. This is taught through dedicated wellbeing lessons, assemblies and carefully planned theme days and weeks.





### Positive Reinforcement

We use positive reinforcement in order to promote and support a safe and happy learning environment. Examples of positive reinforcement are:

- Verbal praise and positive feedback.
- Sharing good work with others, including the Head of Year, Assistant Head or Head of Primary.
- House points.
- Stickers, notes or email home.
- Safa Stars Certificate is awarded weekly by the class teacher for following Safa values and class rules, helping others, progress, attainment and grit.
- Music, Art, PE, Swimming, Islamic and Arabic Stars will be given to three House Points.
- The Learning Grit Badge is awarded to children who continuously

### Houses

At Safa Community School we place a huge value on our House System and the personal development of students outside of the classroom environment. All students are given one of our four houses on their arrival at SCS helping to formulate part of their wider school identity and promote their social development.

To promote the social development of a student at SCS we try to create a sense of belonging for our students by developing school pride, involvement and participation. A sense of belonging develops confidence in each learner which encourages self esteem. The house system encourages leadership potential amongst learners by developing trust, giving responsibility, and expecting accountability. House captains will be the leaders and act as role models and mentors to those other students in their house. They are responsible for promoting the ethos of their house and encourage participation of all members during competitions and events.

The house system allows all learners to be involved and work towards some common goals alongside their peers. Throughout the year each child will almost certainly represent his/her House competitively at various times.

#### House Tops

In order to raise the profile of our House System at Safa Community School, we have house T-shirts as part of the school uniform requirement (applicable to Year 1 – 13). These coloured house tops are a regular part of the school uniform with students being able to wear them on a number of Inter-House events such as sports days, cross-country, swim galas, house competitions and many more.

In addition to the mandatory house T-shirt, students also have the chance to purchase additional optional sporting attire that can be used for PE lessons or ECA/Squad sessions.



### Assessment and Reporting

#### Assessment

At Safa Community School, we use various types of assessment to ensure a comprehensive evaluation of student progress. These assessments include GL progress tests, which provide standardised measures of achievement in core subjects. Additionally, computer based tests and diagnostics such as spellzone and NGRT (reading) are used to gather information which is analysed and used to inform planning.

Teacher judgement plays a crucial role, where educators utilise their knowledge and expertise to assess students based on classroom observations, assignments and interactions. Independent tasks are set throughout the year, allowing students to showcase their understanding and skills through individual pieces of work or projects.

This triangulation of information is used to ensure a well rounded and accurate assessment of each student's learning journey.

### Reporting to Parents

Maintaining open and transparent communication with parents is a priority for us at SCS to keep them well-informed about their child's progress and learning. To achieve this, the school follows a comprehensive reporting system that includes two written reports per year. These reports provide insight into academic achievements, progress and where your child is working in relation to their year group expectations.

Parent-teacher meetings are conducted to facilitate face to face or online discussions between parents and teachers. These meetings serve as a valuable opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of their child's academic, social and emotional development.

#### Reviewing Learning

Regular channels of communication at SCS ensure that parents are actively engaged in their child's education, creating a collaboration between home and school. Our open door policy means that parents can email or arrange to meet with a member of the team any time to discuss concerns or ask any questions they may have about their child's learning.

Our online platform Seesaw is used to share weekly overviews with parents and lessons and activities will be posted on here. Every half term, students take their books home to provide the opportunity to share and discuss their work and progress with their parents. We find that this allows parents to see exactly what the children have been learning.



## Every child has a place at SCS



SCS is a community committed to Inclusion, where personalised learning puts the child at the heart of the curriculum. We follow the well-being model to ensure that each child is supported emotionally and socially as well as academically.

Within our diverse school community, the needs of all children are supported, valued and respected. This may include supporting children with social, emotional and academic challenges, children that are gifted and talented, and children that are English Language Learners. The Inclusion Team support personalised learning, where appropriate, through specific targeted interventions or enhancements, and curriculum or environment adaptations.



### Relationships

### Parental Involvement

#### Communication

Parents receive direct access to teachers and leaders through our open door policy including arranging meetings, email addresses and parent ISAMS.

#### Whatsapp Groups

Each class will have a parent Whatsapp group which is managed by a class parent representative. This is an optional group that you can join for reminders and parental support.

#### Seesaw

This is our main learning platform which provides a digital portfolio of your child's learning and it is also a simple parent communication tool.

### This Week We Are Learning То

Each week, your child's classroom teacher will post an overview for you on Seesaw. This includes what the children will be learning, highlights of the week, key focus and any home learning.

### Home Learning

Home learning is optional however encouraged for all of our students with a mix of online and practical activities to complete weekly. We promote little and often so that children have the opportunity to consolidate and reinforce their learning.

### Parental Involvement

### Parent Teacher Meetings

These take place on a regular basis with the option of online or face to face meetings to support our parents. Although there are set dates for parent teacher meetings throughout the year, we do encourage parents to reach out to teachers at any time if they have any questions or would like to discuss any specific areas of their child's learning.

### Children's Books

Throughout the school year, children's books will be sent home for parents to view the learning and progress that their children are making. This is a great opportunity for parents to spend some time with their child celebrating their achievements and talking about their learning.

#### Events

### Uniform

Our Primary students have different uniforms depending on their timetable for the day. On days when children have PE or Swimming, they will come to school wearing their PE kit. ### Snack and Lunch

Children have two dedicated eating breaks in their day to allow for them to have a snack and their lunch time.

### Packed Lunch

### How am I kept informed regarding my child's development?

An end-of-term report is shared at the end of term 1 and term 3. Parent-teacher conferences take place in term 1 and term 2. Parents are also regularly updated via our parent communication app - Seesaw.

### My child does not speak English, how will they be supported?

Our inclusion team work very closely with class teachers to ensure the needs of all children are met and to put strategies in place to support all children in achieving their best potential. Partnership with parents also plays a vital role here as teachers work to support language development.


